CCRA's Community Day this year is focussing on community safety. The recent tragic event in Woolwich has reminded us that terrorism remains a concern to all. We are very fortunate that joining us at 1.15 pm will be members of the Metropolitan Police who will give a presentation on **Counter-terrorism and Community Safety**.

- What do the police do to make us safe?
- How can I help with the fight against terrorism?
- What do I do if I think something is suspicious?

Come along and get answers from the experts.

After the Met's presentation, Jackie Watson from the Royal Borough of Greenwich's Trading Standards department will tell us about door step crime and the Nominate a Neighbour Scheme to help protect vulnerable members of our neighbourhood.

During the afternoon there will be information tables and experts giving advice on:

- Transport safety
- Noise nuisance
- Anti-social behaviour
- Women's safety
- Community safety
- Trading Standards

Our Safer Neighbourhood Team and Councillor Jane Gilman will be attending to meet with you and talk about their work in the community.
