**Winter Awareness**

Now that the nights are drawing in and Winter approaches remember some simple Winter safety tips:

- burglars are active in the run up to Xmas so - once it's dusky, draw your curtains to prevent displaying all your valuable to potential burglars;
- secure the back of your property and any sheds against burglars;
- do not buy anything from door step sellers – if in doubt tell them to return at a later date and then contact Trading Standard (0208 921 8223 or [tradingstandards@royalgreenwich.gov.uk](mailto:tradingstandards@royalgreenwich.gov.uk));
- check on elderly neighbours regularly to ensure they are safe and warm;
- if holding Xmas celebrations be mindful of noise nuisance or if your neighbours are noisy ring 0208 921 8921.

**Crime stats**

The Mayor's Office for Policing and Crime (MOPAC) is the strategic body for the oversight of policing in London. They run regular meetings with members of the public. The last Greenwich MOPAC meeting was held on 21<sup>st</sup> October 2014. Stephen Greenhalgh (Deputy Mayor for Policing and Crime), Helen King (Assistant Commissioner for Territorial Policing) and Detective Chief Superintendent and our Borough Commander Helen Millichap answered questions from the audience. Overall the news on crime was optimistic with reductions in many crimes, such as theft (down 12%) and criminal damage (down 20%). However, some crimes such as domestic violence and theft from motor vehicles did not fall as much as expected given the Met's pledge to reduce these crimes by 20% by 2016. This is very much the picture in Greenwich. How well our Safer Neighbourhood Team serviced our area was a 'hot' topic

for discussion with questions to the Panel about staffing statistics, shift patterns, abstractions (taken from Charlton duties to elsewhere) and frequency of community meetings. For more information about policing in London see:
