### **Foul Watch**

Have you ever stepped in one of those little 'packages' left on a pavement and had to cope with dog mess on your shoes? It's disgusting, embarrassing and preventable. Following complaints from members of the Watch we contacted RBG for information on their preventative measures. Unlike many areas that have had posters put on lamp-posts and stencils on their pavements etc. to raise awareness, our area has received little attention of late. There have been no fixed penalties issued in our neighbourhood for this anti-social activity. CCNWatch have also done some research into successful campaigns that have reduced the incident of dog fouling. Many of these campaigns start with establishing the extent of the problem. To this end CCNWatch, in collaboration with Charlton Central Residents' Association's (CCRA) Environment Group, are planning to map the incidents of fouling. We need to investigate if there are any consistent patterns and 'hot spots' around our area. Please help us in collating data.
