Many will have seen the recent press articles regarding the fatal stabbing of Tobi Animashaun after leaving work in one of the retail units near Anchor and Hope Lane. This horrific incident occurred on the day of Derrick and Atlas Gardens Summer Fayre (11th September). The police have arrested Jeremiah Lloyd Johnson of Walnut Road, Leyton, who has been charged with murder. Our sympathies are extended to Mr Animashaun's family.

SNT policing priorities

A member of our Watch attends most SNT Policing Panel meetings. At these meeting the community agree the policing priorities. Policing priorities mean that police maintain extra vigilance in these areas, often with additional patrols. The current priorities for the area are: the shops/station in Charlton Church Lane and around the Valiant House area. This is to curb anti-social behaviour.
