We hope 2020 started on a positive note for you. In Charlton the best news to kick off the New Year was the arrest of a burglar, caught red handed in The Heights. He was known to the SNT and they are confident his arrest will significantly influence our burglary rates.

999 - you don't have to ring them

Did you know that you don't have to dial 999 to get the emergency services. Don't leave it until you are in a compromising or dangerous situation. To use this service you first need to register. To register text 'register' to 999. They will send you a text back to complete the registration. It takes seconds and can then be used in an emergency situation. When texting it is helpful if you can let the operatives know **Who** you need (police, ambulance, fire brigade or coast guard). **What** briefly is the emergency and **Where** you are. They will then text back with what will happen next.

Reporting non emergency crime

Phoning 101 (or 0800 40 50 40) is how most people report non-emergency crime but now you can text this information on 61016. Texting this information has some advantages - note this example:

'Abusive man on the 7pm London Bridge to Dartford service. He was threatening people, and then got off Charlton.' Provide a description etc. and the police can act in real time. Alternatively you can email using this address 61016@btp.pnn.police.uk

Safer Neighbourhood Panel - Policing Stats

The January Safer Neighbourhood Panel meeting looked at the year on year comparison of our local crime stats: burglary saw a seasonal spike but still down, theft from motor vehicles slightly up and robbery saw no change. Whilst no crime is acceptable we remain in a low crime area compared to the borough and London averages. The current local priorities are all associated with anti-social behaviour in the areas around Charlton Church Lane/Floyd Road and the Village.
