

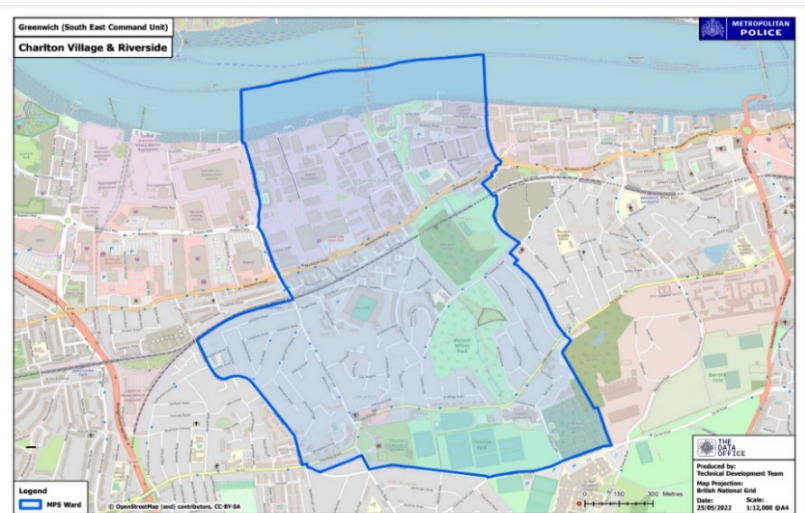
Charlton Village & Riverside Safer Neighbourhood Team Newsletter July 2024 Greenwich Police

Charlton Village & Riverside Ward

Over the last month ward officers have been continuing to deal with a wide range of **ASB** issues across the ward.

In response to reports of **Anti-Social Behaviour**, we have been patrolling the hotspots area such as *Charlton House, Charlton Station, Barney Close, Charlton Park, Wellington Gardens, Maryon Park, Maryon Wilson Park, Charlton Church Lane, St Alfege Road and the Village.*

We helped with reassurance visits for burglaries, hate crime, shoplifting and vehicle crime and we have assisted other wards with crime scenes, arrest enquiries, protests, traffic operations and social events around Greenwich.



We assisted a successful drugs warrant near Hornfair Park, two males arrested for possession with intent to supply class A and B drugs and possession of offensive weapons. A large number of weapons have been seized from the property and off our streets.

A shoplifter was stopped and detained by our PCSO's while on foot patrol at Charlton Village, the individual was found in possession of stolen goods and was dealt with accordingly. He was issued with a caution plus 3 and a community resolution order.

During our routine patrol in Maryon Park, our police officers have found a camping tent used for Anti Social Behaviour. A park ranger was contacted to remove it from the park to prevent any further ASB.

During the last month, the Met has introduced the OPERATION MOONTWIST where the police is conducting investigation regarding Modern Slavery.

On the 17th of July 2024, we attended the **Charlton Village & Riverside Ward Panel Meeting at Langhorne House**, where the **Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT)** presented crime statistics for the past few months, alongside priorities and action plans to enhance community welfare.

Main priorities for the next three months include increased patrols in hotspot area especially to target drug dealers, tackle ASB and Shoplifting around the main shopping chain in the area and increasing the level of the Community Engagement over the Summer.

We, also, have been patrolling around Charlton House to give reassurance around the area during the event “Lunchtime Concert at Charlton House”. We are continuing to assist other agencies with Mental Health Assessments, helping residents with issues related to Breaches of the Peace, helping with Warrants for various matters.

We urge everyone to remain vigilant and to contact their local teams for advice or in an emergency dial 999.
